2020/119 **Apologies** - None

2020/120 **Declarations of interest (existence and nature) with regards to items on the agenda** – None

2020/121 **Planning**

P20/S2095/HH – Pear Tree Cottage, Wharf Road, Shillingford

NC reported that if it was not for the property being a listed building this proposal would not require planning permission and advised Councillors to support the application. JB felt some consideration should be given to neighbours particularly in relation to noise. BP proposed and MH seconded that councillor should vote on NC recommendation after which there would be a further vote on JB Qualifying remarks. Six voted to support the proposal. A second vote to approve JB remarks then took place with 4 in favour and 3 abstaining.

2020/122 **To discuss a request from PAGE 2020 for any refunds due from PAGE to WPC to be retained for use in the continuing opposition against Gravel Extraction.** BP had been approached by James Nettleton with this request. The current site under review is in the Newington, Stadhampton & Berinsfield Area. Discussion included whether we continue to support the campaign, it appears that Berinsfield may support the plan for gravel extraction in opposition to the other two parishes. JB felt that PAGE should provide figures of what money is likely to be needed and if there was a balance at the end of the campaign how was it to be distributed amongst the contributing councils, Warborough having made a significant contribution over the years. BP to ask for more clarification to enable Council to make a more informed decision at the September meeting.

2020/123 **To discuss the possible Speed Reduction on Wharf Road, Shillingford from 30–20 mph**
Residents of Wharf Road, who have experienced high volume of traffic since COVID-19 restrictions have been eased has asked the Council to support the application for a reduction in speed limit following a meeting with OCC officials. It should be noted that following the publication of the Agenda for this meeting there had been a flurry of similar requests from other parts of the Parish. There was a great deal of discussion around the Councils current work in traffic management around the village. The Council had committed to a full traffic survey on the completion of the Six Acres site and it would be wrong to single out one road at this stage. BP asked Councillors to vote on the Wharf Road request with the result of 2 approving and 5 opposing.

2020/124 **Any other Business**

WP, reverting to the subject of traffic management requested that Council make full use of the information that the SID's were recording and it should be used to inform the residents by a report in the Parish Magazine. With the ongoing concerns of Wallingford Road & Henley Road residents he asked for Traffic Management to be an agenda item for the September meeting.

JB advised that CFO had now responded and would be helping him & HB with the village survey on the priorities of Capital projects

WP said he was still having difficulty with the new email and asked HB to contact D. Playford with his issues
The Infrastructure & Environment councillors will meet over summer recess to provide a plan of action on trees and other outstanding items for presentation in September.
