Warborough Church is open every day, free to enter, and maybe - just maybe - you'll leave with something special! The Church is the largest Community space in Warborough and, together with St. Laurence Hall, is for the benefit of everyone in our community.

Our Regular Sunday Worship

Average Sunday attendance, 40; Average weekly attendance, 77: similar to pre-Covid.

- Holy Communion with Hymns (Parish Eucharist) at 11am on the 1st & 3rd Sundays;
- Holy Communion without Hymns at 6pm on the 2nd & 8am on the 4th Sunday;
- Morning Prayer with Hymns at 11am on the 2nd Sunday;
- · Evensong with Hymns at 6pm on the 4th Sunday.

We also hold, throughout the year, a very wide range of other Services & Events

- · Community Hub for Life-Events;
- St. Laurence CE Primary School-in-Church;
- · Community Social Events in St. Laurence Church and St. Laurence Hall;
- · Significant Religious Festivals.

Community Hub for Life-Events in 2023

- 6 Baptisms & 3 Marriages: a joy for all, with up to 52 & 156 attending, respectively;
- 8 [+4 in '24] Funerals & 5 Interment of Ashes: times to share the grief of the bereaved and to give thanks for the lives of the departed, whether 6 or 275 gather together;
- Special Commemorative Service of Holy Communion on Coronation Sunday, May (47);
- St. Laurence Feast on The Green in August: with Benson & Roke Band and the (relatively) new Rector of the Dorchester Team, the Rev'd Jane Willis (84);
- All Souls Service in October: to remember and give thanks for the departed (56);
- Remembrance Sunday Service: held at War Memorial, with Parish Council&RAF (163).

St. Laurence CE Primary School-in-Church in 2023

An Academy within the Oxford Diocesan Schools' Trust

- Celebration for Mothers: with 99 children + 71 adults, ahead of Mothering Sunday;
- Celebration for Fathers: with 98 children + 81 adults, ahead of Fathers' Day, in June;
- Harvest-in-School: ahead of Harvest Festival Sunday, in October;
- School Service of Remembrance: at the War Memorial, in November;
- School Carol Service: with 101 children + 91 adults, ahead of Christmas Day;
- Celebration for Mothers: with 103 children+79 adults, ahead of Mothering Sunday ['24].

Community Social Events in St. Laurence Church and St. Laurence Hall in 2023

- The "Oxford Gospel Choir": the most recent social event organised by The Friends of St. Laurence Church brought joy to a full Church, 140 adults+10 children [early 2024];
- St. Laurence Hall continued to welcome Lunch Club, Village Coffee, After-Church Coffee & Conversation, WI, Mowers & Growers, and many more;
- St. Laurence Church continued to welcome visiting groups: Bell-ringers, Walkers, University of the Third Age (u3a).

Significant Religious Festivals in Church during 2023

- Palm Sunday, with donkey-led procession from The Green;
- Holy Week: Compline (Monday-Wednesday), Maundy Thursday, Good Friday;
- Easter Sunday Family Eucharist: with 6 children + 65 adults [in March 2024];
- Pentecost (Whit Sunday);
- Harvest Festival, followed by lunch in St. Laurence Hall in October;
- Carols by Candlelight at Christmas: with 116; and at the Six Bells;
- Crib Service on Christmas Eve, bringing delight to 13 children + 40 adults;
- Christmas Day Family Eucharist: with 8 children + 46 adults.
